Another way Ms. Klaus uses her Lumens visual presenter is as an aid in writing. She ‘lifts’ students writing and projects it for the whole class to discuss. “We can then examine the strengths and shortcomings of the writing. I usually highlight areas of interest that we can all focus on. Without the Lumens visual presenter, students can’t review their classmates’ writing. Furthermore, having the flexibility to write on the document allows the activity to be interactive.”

Ms. Klaus says the visual presenter is a tool that engages students by drawing their attention to the screen. And she likes how the visualizer eliminates the need to make time consuming transparencies; and that gives her more time for planning and class preparation.
