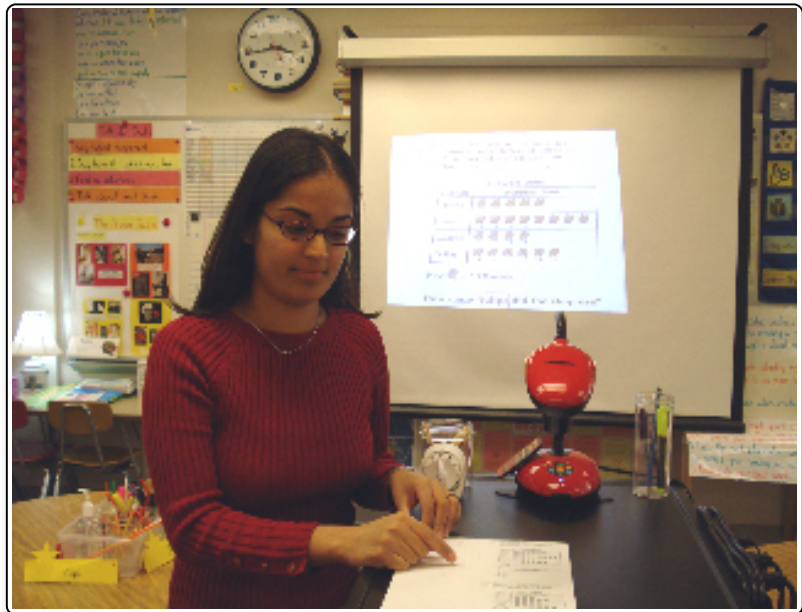


Lumens Visual Presenters Keep Students Engaged in Classroom Work

When she conducts “Investigations Math,” Ms. Fraccaro can model math games with three-dimensional cubes, pattern blocks and coins, which she was unable to do with a conventional overhead projector. In her “Being a Writer” classes she projects student work on a screen and can point out their use of robust language, descriptive words, capitalization and punctuation. “This empowers my students, as they appreciate how their work is being shown to the entire class. It’s also amazing how this type of technology can be used to praise student’s hard work.” ■
